

Composer-in-Residence Jenni Brandon

Award-winning composer Jenni Brandon enjoys engaging with performers and audiences, and giving talks about the business of music and the art of collaboration. Many ensembles perform her commissioned music both nationally and internationally. As a conductor, she has led both church and community choirs and she makes guest appearances to conduct her works. She is also active as a mezzo-soprano and has sung with the Boston Pops, Pacific Chorale, Los Angeles Philharmonic, and at the Hollywood Bowl.



Recent commissions include We Are Joy, a piano concerto for choir and chamber orchestra, a bassoon concerto for Dr. Christin Schillinger (Ithaca College), and a new soprano and oboe work for soprano Dr. Amy Yeung (University of Tennessee at Martin). Brandon is in demand as a composer of music for double reeds, and her works have been featured on the International Double Reed Society conferences. Her works are published by Boosey & Hawkes, Santa Barbara Music Publishing, Graphite Publishing, TrevCo Music Publishing, Imagine Music, Jenni Brandon Music, and soon Pavana Publishing.

Recordings of Brandon's music appear on the Delos, Albany, Centaur, MSR Classics, and Longhorn Labels. Her album Songs of California: Music for Winds and Piano, was nominated for the 10th Independent Music Awards. Brandon is the recipient of numerous awards including the Sorel Medallion, the American Prize for Choral Composition, the Women Composers festival of Hartford International Composition Competition, and the Bassoon Chamber Music Composition Competition. She also teaches yoga in Long Beach, California, and owns Bloom Yoga which specializes in private, corporate, and prenatal yoga.


